Questionnaires for the 2010 Census will be delivered after March 15, 2010.

You should receive a questionnaire at each of your residences, but you should be counted only at the one where you spend the largest part of the year. **Census forms do not include instructions for snowbirds, so you will need to keep this flyer handy.**

To be counted in the right place:

- **RETURN** the form you receive at your **seasonal residence** after completing **ONLY Question 1**.
 - ✓ Question 1 asks how many people are “living or staying” at this residence on April 1st. This actually means “how many people are living here as their usual residence or staying here while having no usual residence elsewhere.” If everyone in the household spends the largest part of the year at a different address, **ENTER ZERO for Question 1**.
 - ✓ It is also a good idea to write “Usual residence elsewhere” so the Census Bureau knows why you are saying no one is living at this address.
- **COMPLETE** and return the census form that you receive at your **usual residence**.
 - ✓ If you do not find a form when you return home, then you can wait for a census worker to come to your door in May or June.
 - ✓ If someone else will fill out this census form before you return, make sure they remember to include you. (Remember—if this is your “usual residence,” then you are considered to be “living” there on April 1st even if you are temporarily absent.)
 - ✓ (after March 19th) If you have already been counted at the wrong place or omitted from the form on which you should have been included, then you can submit corrections on a “Be Counted” form that you can pick up at a local library or other public location.
